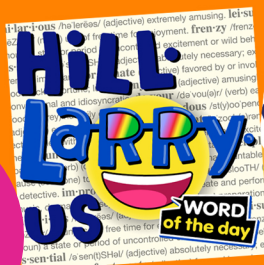
...need some support with independent reading.

3-5 YEARS OLD

-  • **Piper and the Dots:** Tag along on various playdates as Piper and the three musical notes find adventure around their home and neighborhood.

6-9 YEARS OLD

-  • **Grimm, Grimmer, Grimest:** Grimm fairy tales, reimagined. Each episode features a tale being told, and the related commentary from a class of elementary-aged kids.
-  • **Anytime Art:** Create a virtual art class at home with guided projects that include paper sculptures, self portraits, abstract paintings, and more.
-  • **A to Z Mysteries Clue Club:** Based on the wildly popular book series, your kids can tag along and solve crimes all over the fictional town of Green Lawn!
-  • **Don't Break The Rules:** Comedy improv gets a twist with crazy characters imagined by kids (a Vampire Carrot, a Rusty Tricycle, a Swedish Meatball, etc.).

10-12 YEARS OLD

-  • **Dream Breachers:** A fantastical story about a tween boy who discovers that he has the ability to move freely between the world of dreams and reality. Listen to an episode per day or binge the series.
-  • **Origins Unknown:** It's up to Max Emmerson and his friends to find out who... or what... is sending the mysterious packages to residents of his small town in this horror series.
-  • **ExtraBLURT Game Show:** A short, interactive game show that features age-appropriate questions. Browse the list of episodes to find a theme your kids are into and get playing!
-  • **TIME for Kids Explains:** Kid reporters from TIME for Kids magazine share the week's news. Open up a dialogue by discussing topics raised.
